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CLASS PLACEMENT INFORMATION

We are already looking ahead to the new school year and will soon begin the process of organizing next year's classes. In developing our new class structure, our goal is to ensure your children have an outstanding educational experience in an inviting and welcoming classroom community.

Our classes work best when they include members of differing interests, abilities, and perspectives. This gives students the opportunity to learn from and about each other. These experiences help to open students' minds to new ideas and new possibilities, allowing them to test limits and develop their true potential.

To do this, it's important for us to look at a number of factors, including:

Learning Style: We consider how students learn best and which classroom environment will best support their needs.

Ability, Interests and Talents: All children are unique and have their own set of strengths and abilities. Having a grouping of students whose strengths compliment each other will help enhance everyone's learning.

Relationships: We aim to create groups that allow for respectful and caring peer relationships with opportunities to meet new students as well as spending time with some familiar friends.

Your input will be considered in relation to the criteria listed above, and where placement options are available.

GRADE 8 STUDENTS – MESSAGE ABOUT COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS

The District School Board of Niagara encourages all students to explore a wide variety of community experiences and activities in order to develop an understanding of the various roles they can play in their community and to help them develop a greater sense of belonging within their community. As part of the Ontario secondary school diploma requirements, every student is required to complete a minimum 40 hours of community involvement. These activities may be completed at any time starting the summer before a student enters Grade 9 and after reviewing the expectations and regulations. Students are encouraged to complete their hours early in their high school career.

Students can access the D2L resources using their DSBN student login and password. By visiting https://dsbn.org and clicking Staff and Student Login, where they will have access to the D2L icon and login. In this space, students will have access to the information about eligible and ineligible activities, and a link to search for volunteer opportunities in the Niagara Region.

Before starting a volunteer experience, students need to watch the video and review the materials in the D2L course, so they understand the expectations and know what is eligible as an activity. We do not want students participating in an activity that risks their safety and well-being or disappoint them to learn their experience was not eligible after their participation.

SUMMER SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITY FOR STUDENTS

Social-emotional skills are essential for connecting with others, managing emotions, feeling empathy and building healthy relationships. The Mental Health and Well-being team is excited to continue to offer Social Emotional Learning programs to all DSBN students completing grades 1 to 12 over the summer months.

Merrell's Strong Start, Strong Kids, and Strong Teens will be offered for six weeks (July 10th – August 18th, 2023) virtually on Microsoft Teams. This high-quality, research-based Social-Emotional Learning program promotes resilience by teaching students everyday skills to overcome challenges in positive ways. Programming will occur two days per week for 1.5 hours with students of similar ages grouped together. Access to technology is required to participate in the programming.

NSTS BACK-TO-SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

At the end of August, Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) will post specific back to school transportation arrangements for each student that qualifies for busing, including bus route numbers, stop locations and times.

Please visit **www.nsts.ca** and sign-in to the secure parent portal to get your child's student transportation information. To sign-in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which can be found on their report card. While signed-in, please subscribe to the delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child's bus route.

Eligibility information is also available through the portal including walking directions if your child lives within the walk zone of the school and is not eligible for transportation service. Changes to home, pick-up or drop-off addresses must be made through your child's school. During the summer you may notify NSTS of address changes so we can make sure a bus stop is available for your child to start the school year, however, NSTS is not authorized to change student address information.

With the availability of the secure parent portal, *NSTS will not mail student transportation notices* with the exception of Kindergarten students or new students to the system who do not have an OEN to sign-in to the portal. Please contact your school or NSTS if you have questions regarding your child's transportation arrangements.

Please note that if you have opted-in your child/children for student transportation for this school year (2022/23), there is no need to opt-in again for next school year (2023/24).

WHAT SCHOOL SUPPLIES WILL MY CHILD NEED?
