What is the School Culture Survey? The School Culture Survey is a valuable opportunity for students in Grades 4-12, their families and DSBN school staff to help us learn more about your experiences at school. The questions will be organized into five main factors that help create your school culture: Well-Being; Caring and Safe Schools; Sense of Belonging; Equity and Inclusion; Teaching and Learning.

When can Students Grades 4-8 and their Families do the Survey? Students in Grades 4-8 will be asked to take the survey during class time between February 7-22, 2022. Families will be sent the survey to take within this time as well. This survey will be entirely anonymous and confidential. While it is voluntary to take, the more responses we receive, the more effective the DSBN can be in supporting your family moving forward.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY TO DSBN ACADEMY?

- Student must live within the Niagara Region
- Student is entering Grade 6, 7 or 8 in September 2022
- Student would be the first in their family to graduate from a college or university program
 - If a sibling has attended post-secondary but the parent(s)/guardian(s) have not, the student is still considered a First Generation Student
- Student is achieving current grade level expectations or just below
- Student has demonstrated the potential for achieving "good" or "excellent" learning skills
- Student is willing to attend a school that may be out of their community with free transportation provided
 - Student understands there are mandatory after-school academic supports and ENCORE programs
 - After-school *ENCORE* options include: Mixed sports, Board games, Photography, Yoga, Makerspace, Choir, Reading, and many more!
- Families understand that the DSBN Academy is a single track pathway beginning in Grade 9 (academic level only)

WINTER IS HERE!

With the cold and wet weather upon us, we have a few reminders for comfortable and safe outdoor play during the winter months:

- 1. Bring appropriate outdoor clothing to school daily (hat, mitts, jacket, snow pants, and boots).
- 2. Have dry indoor shoes and keep an extra outfit at school too (in case shirt and pants get wet outside).
- 3. Students are not permitted to throw snow or slide on ice patches. Students who disobey these rules will be sent indoors to the office.

All students will continue to have gym classes outside, in the winter months, weather permitting. Kindergarten children will also continue to have outdoor exploration time during the winter months.

Our 2 outdoor fitness breaks will occur regularly throughout the winter except in when an extreme cold weather alert is issued by the Niagara Region. For this reason, it is essential that students come prepared for the weather! We appreciate your efforts!

PARENT'S ROLE IN KEEPING SCHOOLS SAFE

As you are aware, all staff and students must self-screen every day before attending school. As part of our ongoing commitment to student safety, and as recommended by the Ministry of

Education and Niagara Public Health, we added an active screening process that allows schools to verify if the daily school screening has been completed. Each day, if the student screener is not completed a follow up email will be sent to parents reminding them to complete it at that time. Everyone has a role to play in keeping families safe and reducing the spread of COVID-19. One of the most effective strategies is keeping COVID out of our schools and the daily COVID assessment is essential in achieving this goal. Please note that the DSBN is not collecting any specific health data about students or the results of the screening. Our system only reports confirmation that the screening has or has not been completed.

PINK SHIRT DAY

Anti-Bullying Day, also known as Pink Shirt Day, is recognized on the last Wednesday in February in Canada. On February 23, we encourage all members of the River View community to wear something pink to symbolize that we at River View will not tolerate bullying.

What is bullying?

Bullying is aggressive behaviour that is typically repeated over time. It is meant to cause harm, fear or distress or create a negative environment at school for another person. Bullying occurs in a situation where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.

Is conflict the same as bullying?

People may sometimes confuse conflict with bullying, but they are different. Conflict occurs between two or more people who have a disagreement, a difference of opinion or different views. Conflict between students does not always mean its bullying. Children learn at a young age to understand that others can have a different perspective than their own, but developing the ability to gain perspective takes time and the process continues into early adulthood (Stepping Stones: A Resource on Youth Development, page 26). IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES

Transportation and School Closures

There are times in Niagara when weather conditions are so poor that we must cancel student transportation, and/or close schools to preserve the safety of students and staff. The decision to cancel transportation and/or close schools is not taken lightly; a variety of factors are considered when making this choice. Transportation Cancellations:

Information about transportation delays and cancellations are posted to <u>https://portal.nsts.ca/Cancellations.aspx</u>. When transportation is cancelled, every effort is made to communicate the decision by 6:00 am on the day of the cancellation. There are times when transportation is cancelled, but schools remain open. If, on those days you feel it is best for your child to stay home, please report your child's absence <u>https://dsbn.org/safearrival/</u> so we can make sure they are safe at home.

School Closures:

When the decision to close schools is made, it refers to all schools: both in-person and remote learners. Every effort will be made to share school closure information before 6:00 am on the day of the school closure. You will find it on dsbn.org, all school websites, DSBN social media, and local media share the news widely as well.

NSTS IMPORTANT NOTICE (FROM JANUARY 17, 2022)

NSTS wanted to make you aware that we have a school bus driver for every route, but not enough extra drivers to cover absences. NSTS and bus companies are making every effort to provide service daily to all eligible students; however, there may be service disruptions resulting in delays and individual route cancellations. Every effort will be made to post individual route cancellations by 6:00 a.m.

Students are required to follow their school board procedure for self-assessment prior to arriving at the bus stop. Students (including Kindergarten students) are required to wear a face covering on the bus and sit in their assigned seat. THE NOSE KNOWS: NO SCENTS MAKES SENSE

Scented products have chemicals that can cause health reactions in people with asthma, migraines, allergies, or environmental sensitivities. Please help keep our air breathable for everyone and use unscented or scent reduced products where possible. Woodland is a Scent-Reduced Environment. Some staff and students have a sensitivity to odours, smells, and scents. Please do not wear, or send your child with, perfume, cologne, after shave, or scented body lotion into the school.

ANAPHYLAXIS – BE NUT AWARE!

Anaphylaxis is a severe and potentially life-threatening reaction to certain food substances. We have students in our school that suffer from a severe allergy which can cause an anaphylactic reaction. An anaphylactic reaction is an allergic reaction so severe that in some cases, it can be life threatening. These children have a severe allergy to nuts. Prevention is the best approach. Therefore, we ask your cooperation in not sending any snacks or lunches containing nut products with your child.

DSBN SOCIAL WORKER SUPPORT AVAILABLE

Do you have questions about your child's mental health and well-being, such as anxiety, behaviour, or self-harm? Do you need support in accessing supports in the community?

Do you need advice for setting goals to help with regular school attendance? Do you have any questions or looking for support regarding a certain aspect of parenting?

If these are some questions that you have, please speak with your child's teacher or Ms. Cocco or Ms. Randall. All DSBN schools work with a DSBN Social Worker who supports families to provide an additional layer of support to help our students and families achieve success.

TERM 1 REPORT CARD UPDATE

Elementary Provincial Report Card (Grades 1-8) and the Kindergarten: Communication of Learning

The Elementary Provincial Report Card (Grades 1-8) and the Kindergarten: Communication of Learning will be issued on February 17.

Report cards give a summary of student achievement at the end of each term. Teachers use their professional judgement and consider factors such as consistency, recent improvement, and amount of evidence in order to determine students' grades or marks. Teachers and students work together to gather evidence of their learning over time from observations, conversations, and student products.

This year, the Ontario Ministry of Education updated <u>the math curriculum</u> for Grades 1 to 8 which started in September 2020. The new mathematics curriculum is part of a <u>four-year math strategy</u> designed to:

- improve student performance in math
- help students solve everyday math problems
- increase students' employability to attain the jobs of the future

UPDATES TO ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION IN MATHEMATICS (GRADES 1-8)

To foster a cohesive approach to both instruction and assessment across the elementary mathematics curriculum, achievement in mathematics will be reported in the Elementary Report Card as one overall letter grade (Grades 1-6) or percentage mark (Grades 7-8), with supporting comments. Comments will describe significant strengths demonstrated by the student and identify next steps for improvement. Teachers may also describe a student's growth in learning.
