



#### Term One Report Cards

It is that time of year when our River View teachers are busy writing Term One report cards. Report cards are a way to share a summary of student achievement for each Term. Teachers use their professional judgement and consider factors such as consistency, recent improvement and amount of evidence in order to determine students' grades or marks. Teachers and students work together to gather evidence of their learning over time from observations, conversations, and student products. More specific information will be shared in the February newsletter to support reading and understanding the grades and marks on the report card.

This year the Elementary Provincial Report Cards (Grade 1-8) and Kindergarten: Communication of Learning will be sent home on February 16, 2023.

We are very proud of the progress our Red Hawks have made this year. Please set aside some time to review the report cards with your child and set goals for the second half of the school year.


#### Hot Lunches - Pizza Day

#### WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY TO DSBN ACADEMY?

- Student must live within the Niagara Region
- Student must be entering grade 6, 7, or 8 in September. (Note: spaces are limited in grades 7 and 8)
- Student would be the first in their family to graduate from a college or university. (If a sibling of the student has attended a post-secondary institution but the parent(s)/guardian(s) have not, the student is still considered a first-generation student.)
- Student must be willing to attend a school location, the DSBN Academy site, which may be outside of their community. Transportation will be provided for these students.
- Student understands there is a mandatory after-school program that enhances the student experience beyond the classroom. These include enrichment opportunities and academic supports. After-school ENCORE enrichment opportunities include: Mixed sports, Chess, Karate, Dance, Zumba, Coding, Mad Science, Board games, Photography, Makerspace, Choir, Canvas painting, Crochet, Crafts, Podcasting, Baking, Debating, Drama and many more!
- DSBN Academy Secondary programming is designed to prepare students for College and University.

#### Winter is HERE

With the cold and wet weather upon us, we have a few reminders for comfortable and safe outdoor play during the winter months:

- 1. Bring appropriate outdoor clothing to school daily (hat, mitts, jacket, snow pants, and boots).
- Have dry indoor shoes and <u>keep an extra outfit at</u> <u>school</u> too (in case shirt and pants get wet outside).
- 3. Students are not permitted to throw snow or slide on ice patches.

#### **Transportation Cancellations:**

When transportation is cancelled, every effort is made to communicate the decision by 6:00am on the day of the cancellation. There are times when transportation is cancelled, but schools remain open. If, on those days you feel it is best for your child to stay home, please report your child's absence <a href="https://dsbn.org/safearrival/">https://dsbn.org/safearrival/</a> so we can make sure they are safe at home.

#### **School Closures:**

Every effort will be made to share school closure information before 6:00 am on the day of the school closure. You will find it on dsbn.org, all school websites, DSBN social media, and local media share the news widely as well.

All students will continue to have recess outside, in the winter months, weather permitting. Kindergarten children will also continue to have outdoor exploration time during the winter months.

Our 2 outdoor fitness breaks will occur regularly throughout the winter except in when an extreme cold weather alert is issued by the Niagara Region. For this reason, it is essential that students come prepared for the weather! We appreciate your efforts!
