Well-being at River View

This year students have been learning about the importance of healthy minds by engaging in many different mindfulness activities in their classroom. One strategy that our primary classes are focusing on is identifying and managing emotions. Through the support of our youth counsellor many classes have been introduced to a program called, "Zones of Regulation". This program helps students' categorize feelings into four colored Zones, all of which are expected in life. Once we understand our feelings and zones, we can learn to use tools/strategies to manage our different emotions. The simple, common language and visual structure (see image below) of The Zones of Regulation helps make the complex skill of regulation more concrete for our learners and those who support them. Ask your primary students today to share what they know about "The Zones."
